

ABQ Coro Lux

The undersigned incorporator, who is an individual 18 years of age or older, who is a citizen of the United States and pursuant to the nonprofit corporation laws of this state, hereby adopts the following Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE I. NAME

The name of this corporation is: ABQ Coro Lux.

ARTICLE II. REGISTERED OFFICE

ARTICLE III. REGISTERED AGENT

ARTICLE IV. DURATION

The period of duration is: Perpetual

ARTICLE V. PURPOSE

The specific purpose of this corporation is:

- Provide the opportunity for amateur, semi-professional and professional singers and instrumentalists to perform great musical literature;
- Provide college and high school students additional musical experience by providing a more
 professional venue for them and an opportunity to enhance a college application with a valuable
 cultural experience outside the normal realm. In addition it instills in the students a sense of
 accomplishment; it grants them positions as contributing members of their community; and may
 afford high school students the opportunity to earn high school community volunteer service credits.

This corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, and scientific purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

 in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in
 opposition to any candidate for public office.
- 3. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.
- 4. No member, officer, or director of this corporation shall be personally liable for the debts or obligations of this corporation of any nature whatsoever, nor shall any of the property of the
